The Levine Scholars Program seeks exceptional high school seniors who demonstrate a commitment to community service, hold an academic record that reflects a sustained passion for knowledge and possess a capacity for ethical leadership that elevates fellow students to a higher standard. The program takes the brightest, most capable students and gives them the tools, resources and environment they need to explore the world around them, engage across discipline and excel at the highest levels. Scholars receive:

- An award for four years of tuition, room, board, books and mandatory fees
- An \$8,000 grant to implement a service project of their own design
- Four summers of experiences including [study abroad](#) and [NOLS](#)
- Access to a professional development fund
- An undergraduate experience they will cherish for a lifetime

The total value of this four-year scholarship is estimated at \$105,000 for in-state students and \$155,000 for out-of-state students.

Levine Scholars are eclectic in their interests and pursuits. Our scholars have secured diverse internships at companies and agencies such as Apple, Google, *Martha Stewart Living*, the Manhattan Transit Authority and the Children's Defense Fund. Members of the first four [graduating classes](#) have gone on to explore and achieve at the highest levels. Four alumni are recipients of the prestigious Fulbright U.S. Student Program grant; several are attending graduate school at Carnegie Mellon University, Johns Hopkins University, Princeton University, UNC Chapel Hill, the University of Oxford, University of Pennsylvania and the University of Texas at Austin; others are enrolled at medical school at East Carolina University, Rush Medical College in Chicago and UNC Chapel Hill; and one just completed law school at Stanford University.
